Monday 6th **Hidden Treasures** - As we find a pearl hidden in an oyster, may I find something of Christ in those who irritate me; as I find beautiful grain patterns revealed in a plank sawn from a tree, may I find something of Christ in those with a rough exterior. Tuesday 7th As I find a profusion of flowers from dull seeds hidden in the ground, may I find something of beauty in the most unprepossessing person (Ibid).

Wednesday 8th As I find a polished, shiny conker hidden in its spiky case, may I find something of Christ's light shining in even the most prickly character. Remembering always that the treasure of the light of Christ is found in earthen vessels. (2 Corinthians 4:7 KJV: Ibid)

Thursday 9th A Collect for Ascension Day – Almighty and everlasting Abba Father, you raised our Lord Jesus Christ to your right hand on high. As we rejoice in his exaltation fill us with his Spirit, that we may go into all the world and faithfully proclaim the gospel. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen {The Methodist Worship Book p544)}

Sunday 12th **Christian Aid Week begins** – *I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me (Philippians 4:13)* God, whose Spirit dwells in me, guide me to make plans which further your kingdom. Give me your vision and the courage to follow your path. Amen.

Monday 13th 'And now faith, hope and love remain, and the greatest of these is love, (1 Corinthians 13.13')

Wednesday 15th Wait for God – stand tall and let your heart take courage! Yes, wait for YHWH! (Psalm 27:14 TIB) Jesus you were able to calm the storm and save your followers from disaster. Help me to weather the storms I face, to act against the climate crisis, and to respond to those in need. Amen. (*Ibid*)

Thursday 16th Faith is the reality of all that is hoped for; for faith is the proof of all that is unseen. (Hebrews 1:1 TIB) Lord, your kingdom is one without end. Inspire me with the vision of justice and peace of life before death and of a brighter future. Amen (Ibid)

Friday 17th 'Learn to do good! Search for Justice and help the oppressed! Protect those who are orphaned and plead the case of those who are widowed, (Isaiah 1:17 TIB) YHWH your voice is heard through so many humble people of faith, open my eyes to the realities of poverty around me, open my heart to those you love and help me to reach out and take action. (O Jesu, susses Licht by Joachim Lange, translated by John Wesley StF 562 v4)

Thursday 23rd Pray – 'Lord, arm me with your Spirit's might, since I am called by your great name; in you let all my thoughts unite, of all my works be you the name; your love attend me all my days, and my sole business be your praise'. (*ibid v5*)

Monday 27th Give thanks for the ministry provided by our Minister's, Local Preachers, Worship Leaders, Pastoral Visitors, Stewards, Administrators, Readers, Musicians, Flower Arrangers, Refreshment Providers, all Congregations, and any others who enable Worship and Mission to take place in the Circuit.

Tuesday 28th **Telling others of God's love** -Pray for the other churches around your church, as you take steps together deeper into the gospel – and seek together justice, evangelism inclusion and spiritual growth. (Adapted from methodist.org.uk/evangelism – Methodist Handbook 2023/24 p7)

Wednesday 29th Pray that the Holy Spirit will break through into the Church and 'God's so loved world', and that your spiritual assurance will lead to honesty and courage in outreach and mission. (*Ibid*)

Thursday 30th God of love, God for all, your purposes are more beautiful than we can possibly imagine. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and help me to let go of all that holds me back – as did John and Charles Wesley. Open my life and church to new seasons of humility and faith, of change and growth. Shake me up with the good news of Jesus and show me the way ahead. Amen! (*Ibid*)

Friday 31st Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth: Join with Mary in her song of praise — 'My Soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour.' (Luke 1:46-47) 'Tell out, my soul, the greatness of the Lord! Unnumbered blessings, give my spirit voice; tender to me the promise of his word; in God my Saviour shall my heart rejoice. Amen.
