Dear Friends,

Some of you will have heard that I recently had a climbing accident when trying to negotiate a particularly high-speed bump in Elmbridge RV! This has led me to think a little more deeply about the whole subject of falling. I was reminded that there are a number of references to falling in the Bible...some explicit, others implicit. Perhaps the most significant reference is when Jesus was tempted to throw himself off the pinnacle of the temple and fall towards the ground because: God will command his angels concerning you...on their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone. Of course, Jesus refused to put God to the test and the law of gravity is such that if you stumble as I did then you fall!

I was also reminded of the book written by the American Franciscan priest Richard Rohr entitled *Falling Upward*. Drawing on the wisdom from time-honoured myths, heroic poems, great thinkers and sacred religious texts, the author explores the two halves of life to show that those who have fallen, failed, or 'gone down' are the only ones who understand 'up'. The heartbreaks, disappointments and loves of the first half of life are actually stepping stones to the spiritual joys that the second half has in store for us.

That in turn reminded me that all of us, whatever our age, are in the business not simply of **getting** older but **growing** older...always new things to learn, new ideas to explore, new experiences to be had. When I was a hospital chaplain, I remember visiting a man of 90+ yrs young. He had been a minister in the Independent Methodist Church and this was the very first time in his long life that he had been a hospital patient. "This is a new experience for me" he told me with a sense of anticipation and expectation.

All of you will probably know the famous lines written by the poet Robert Browning: Grow old along with me! The best is yet to be, the last of life, for which the first was made. Our times are in his hand who saith, 'A whole I planned, youth shows but half; Trust God: See all, nor be afraid!'


