Advent is my favourite season in the Christian calendar. The word Advent means 'coming' or 'arrival'. It is a time to anticipate and prepare for Christ coming amongst us. Purple also marks this as a time of seriousness and solemnity.

Maybe it's not the time to start another organisation (and the shortened version of the name has already been taken anyway) but instead to live the Way of Advent. We spend this season in joyful hope of Christ coming amongst us. Amen. Come Lord Jesus.


