## Dear Friends

As a small boy I was often taken by my parents to the nearest seaside resort, west from where we lived in Lancashire. The resort was the genteel seaside town of Southport where the sea was always so far out and the sands so solid that cars could be driven onto, and parked, on them. My dad had a smart green and black Morris10...BU 9059...and I have a photo of me as a 5 or 6 yr old boy sitting on the running board of the car, eating a picnic sandwich, on the sands at Southport!

How could anyone possibly have imagined then the events which unfolded in Southport last week. The killing of three young girls, wherever it happens...be it Southport, Gaza or Ukraine... is unconscionable.

Churches Together in Merseyside put out a statement, part of which read:

Life is a precious gift, and for it to be taken from children so young is truly heartbreaking. We offer our sincere condolences to the families and loved ones of all of those whose lives have been lost. We pray for those who remain critically ill and injured...We commit ourselves afresh to standing against brutality and violence in every form and doing all we can to build safe, caring and strong communities.

Since the stabbings there have been protests in Southport which have spread to towns and cities all over the country and morphed into violence and hatred directed against minority ethnic communities. Church leaders and politicians are speaking out and condemning the fact that Muslim and asylum-seeking communities are under attack and feeling unsafe.

As Christians we remember Christ's command to love our neighbour and I'm sure that across the Methodist church that is what we will continue to do. I'm sure that we would all agree with the Catholic bishop of Down and Connor when he says: "standing in solidarity and seeking an honest dialogue with our sisters and brothers from different cultures and religions is the only authentic Christian way forward."
