Opening Prayers

Here in this place, the Lord of all is made known.

Now, at this time, the Spirit of the divine is present.

Today, as I worship, Christ comes to worship with me.

Show me how to worship you in Spirit and Truth, Lord God,

Amen.

If you have a candle, find it and something to light it. Put it somewhere you can see it. If you do not have a candle, use a lamp.

As you light the candle, or light the lamp, say these words: "the light shines in the darkness and the darkness can never put it out".

Sit in silence and notice the light and the shadows in the room.

When you are ready, offer this time of worship to God: "Jesus, you are the light of the world, the light of my life, I offer this time to you in worship and prayer and praise."

Amen.

Responding to the reading

"But... we've always done it that way."

How often have you heard that sentence in your life? Are you someone who says it a lot? Or more likely to roll your eyes when someone else says it?

There is a story about a church where someone dared to ask the question: "why do we stand when the offering is brought forward?" No-one could answer it.

The tradition that had developed from further back than anyone could remember is that when the offering had been collected during the service, the music started playing and then everyone in the congregation would stand as it was brought forward to the front and the offering prayer would then be duly delivered, and everyone would sit down. I know this does happen in a number of churches, but certainly not all of them.

Incidentally, after chewing it over in a long conversation, the church decided that standing for the offering was a physical expression of the people offering themselves to God and the mission to which they are called. Everyone quite liked that and stood with just a little more enthusiasm from then on! Thankfully also, this resulted in some significant changes in the church to make the welcome much more authentic and relaxed.

Jesus tackles this issue head on in today's gospel reading. In one of his simpler and most straight forward parables he draws a clear distinction between the decision to have the integrity to change your mind and the policy to say you will do something then simply not bother. Inherent in the "right" path is the decision to admit you were wrong in your first assumption and this is often the part people have the most problem with. Jesus is clear about which is right.

Do you, do we, as a church, a society, a world, have the courage to change...

Do you sense a situation in your life where you may need the "courage to change"?

- Personally?
- At church?
- At work?
- With close friends and family?
- With the way you choose to spend your time?

[You may wish to find someone you can trust to talk about these questions with. Why not take a good stretch of time over it and talk over dinner, or a coffee].

Responding in prayer

(Using some of the lines from the Beatitudes).

Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

There are so many people who experience feelings of inadequacy and worthlessness, for a complicated set of reasons.

Do you feel like this right now? - Can you be open to others reaching out?

Jesus brought a gospel message to turn the world upside down, and he told us that those who feel unworthy are blessed. Help us to help them feel a true sense of worth.

Help me Lord Jesus, to change my mind and heart for good.

Blessed are the meek: for they shall possess the land.

The world has many people who exist under the radar. Passive, unassuming, and serene, and sometimes they are eclipsed by the bold and unyielding.

Do you know anyone who feels like this right now? - Can you reach out?

Do you feel like this right now? - Can you be open to others reaching out?

Jesus brought a gospel message to turn the world upside down, and he told us that those who feel insignificant are blessed. Help us to help them feel brave.

Help me Lord Jesus, to change my mind and heart for good.

Blessed are they who mourn: for they shall be comforted.

Every day someone's loved ones are lost. Those left behind are facing a changed life, an emptiness and a myriad of emotions threatening to tear them apart.

Do you know anyone who feels like this right now? - Can you reach out?

Do you feel like this right now? - Can you be open to others reaching out?

Jesus brought a gospel message to turn the world upside down, and he told us that those who mourn are blessed. Help us to help them feel and nurture a glimmer of hope.

Help me Lord Jesus, to change my mind and heart for good.
