Response to the reading

The people of God are called to continue the work started by God that flourished in Christ. "Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." John 14:12

What in the life of my community is happening because of the people who still are part of a church community, or were part of the church in the past?

Jesus, in the passage we read from John's gospel, was comforting his disciples. These were ordinary people who had witnessed extraordinary acts of God.

Consider what you are doing to continue the work of God? Are you being nudged in a new direction?

Jesus was making known God's presence, God's greatness and mercy, God's grace and glory, God's persistent love on this earth. Jesus talks about the Son making known the Father's glory.

How is God's presence 'made known' to you? Do you make space to listen to what God might be saying to you today? Can you make more space, or help others make a space like this?

Prayers and Prayer Pointers for the Week

Monday 8th May

- Today is an extra bank holiday to celebrate the coronation of the new King of England. Use today as a day to pray for our leaders, in all forms elected or otherwise.
- May they use their positions of power for justice, to care for those most in need, and not for their own ends.

Tuesday 9th May

- Find a ribbon or a piece of string. Tie a knot in it, and think of a person you know who needs prayer.

Wednesday 10th May

- Consider how God is love, and where there is love, there is God. Leave a note, or send a text message, to tell somebody you love them or you're grateful for them.
- Pray for them as you write.

Thursday 11th May

- Think about the fruits of the spirit. Pick one of them that you don't feel you are very good at, or that needs some intentional work. Spend some time praying about this, and then practice it for a whole day in all you do.

Friday 12th May

- Pour a glass of water. Think about the things you do that get in the way of your relationship with God. You might think it muddles the water of your life, but God forgives us for all these things, and offers us living water.
- Drink some of the water and give thanks for the way God reaches out to you with love and forgiveness.

Saturday 13th May

- Light a candle. Jesus is the light of the world. Pray about the places you experience darkness in your life, that Jesus light might shine there.
